

## 10 Winning Tips



1. Parents can buy one or two sets of suitable clothes for the interview, so you don't have to worry about your children's clothes every time.
2. With the exception of international schools and individual English-speaking kindergartens, basically all schools conduct interviews in Cantonese, so parents should focus on practicing their children's Cantonese conversation and coping skills. Switching between Cantonese, English and Mandarin will leave children at a difficult position and weaken their language skills.
3. A few days before the interview, try to arrange for your child to rest more and get enough sleep. On the one hand, it can make the child's mood more stable, and on the other hand, it can help to eliminate the resistance to unfamiliar environments and make the best possible condition for the interview.
4. Before the test, tell your child that he/she will be playing at school and explain the fun parts, such as toys, lots of kids and question-and-answer games.
5. Explain to the children in advance he/she must abide by the rules, such as indisputable toys, to be polite to the teacher to say morning and thank you in order to play in school. If he/she doesn't comply, he/she won't be taken to the school to play.
6. In the interview space, parents should not hold their children, so as not to give the school a sense of dependence.
7. Even if the school specifies only one parent is allowed in the interview, both parents should accompany the kid together to show sincerity and respect for the school.

8. Children's appearance should be mainly clean. Parents can pay attention to whether the nails are trimmed and clean, whether the boy's hair is too long. Do not need to be too fancy or "mature", such as applying lipstick for girls.

9. Your child's clothes can be matched with a little bright color, so that the child looks more spiritual and livelier.

10. Parents should not dress too grandly (e.g. full administrative suit) or too casual (e.g. sports suit), too trendy and inappropriate. Moms can put on a light makeup to show the importance of the interview.
